#### **RECORD OPENING**

The 2011-2012 school year at FOCUS opened with a record number of children and teens enrolled in the Extended Day Treatment Program! FOCUS' capacity is 20 participants a day and two days per week were full on opening day, with the other three approaching full. As of mid-September, 59 children from 32 towns were registered. A waiting list has begun as news of FOCUS and what we can offer spreads!





### THE ETHEL WALKER SCHOOL COLLABORATION

Last May FOCUS presented an Autism Spectrum Unplugged Panel at The Ethel Walker School in Simsbury. The response from the students was overwhelmingly positive.
